Classroom Assessment Tools

Center-based preschool classrooms can choose either the Environment Rating Scales (ERS), or the Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) for assessment. CLASS is not available for infant toddler classrooms or family or group home settings.

Introduction to the Environment Rating Scales (ERS)

The ERS is designed to assess the quality of an early childhood or school age care group. The ERS assessment considers the physical environment, basic care, curriculum, interactions, and program structure. The ERS training explains how the scale is organized, terms frequently used in the scale, and the scoring system.

Please select the ERS training specific to the program type and/or age group:

- Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale − 3 (ECERS-3) is for center based staff working with preschool children (3 − 5 years old)
- Infant/Toddler Environment Rating Scale 3 (ITERS-3) is for center based staff working with infants and toddlers (birth to 35 months old)
- Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale 3 (FCCERS-3) is for mixed age care in a home setting
- School-Age Care Environment Rating Scale- Updated (SACERS-U) is for center based staff working with school age children (5-12 years old)

Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS)

CLASS is designed to help early childhood educators nurture children's early learning while responding to their needs. CLASS training helps participants understand the important link between effective teacher-child interactions and children's progress. Participants gain an understanding of Pre-K development and classroom implications. This training provides information about the CLASS framework, CLASS dimensions and research that informs the CLASS tool.
