NOTE: Level 2 CAP completed near submission of Level 2 verification. Level 3-5 CAP developed at beginning of program working on each level and reviewed and adapted at least quarterly.

Administrator

Quality Activity E: Dedicate time annually to develop and review professional development plans with each EC educator.

Inclusionary Practices

Quality Activity J: Program provides families with access to the ASQ Screening tool within 45 days of enrollment and as needed. (*See Learn & Grow portfolio for referral guidance*)

Quality Activity K: Program uses Pyramid Implementation Data System (PIDS) to record behavior incident reports and expulsion/suspensions.

Curriculum & Assessment

Quality Activity L: Program has completed a curriculum review and selection process and created a plan for implementation of selected curriculum.

Quality Activity M: Program has created a plan for implementation of Teaching Strategies Gold (TSG).

Family & Community

Quality Activity D: TPOTS/TPITOS average score of 70% across all key practices and no red flags in assessed classrooms. —**OR**—CLASS score of 4.0 in 2 of 3 subdomains in assessed classrooms.

Inclusionary Practices

Quality Activity E: Each classroom has at least one teaching staff who communicates screening results with families.

Note: *Must complete training on communicating results with families.*

Quality Activity F: Program has identified local resource agencies and/or Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant to support early childhood professionals and families to develop a plan to meet the individual needs of all children but particularly children with identified special needs (*social emotional, cognitive, physical, etc.*).

Curriculum & Assessment

Quality Activity G: Program uses a developmentally appropriate evidence-based early childhood curricula, including additional curricular enhancements, as appropriate, that: 1) are based on evidence and standardized training, 2) align with all five domains of the Alaska Early Learning Guidelines, and 3) have developmental scope and sequence.

Quality Activity H: Early childhood educators complete a full child assessment twice a year to monitor all children's progress towards meeting developmental outcomes.

Quality Activity 1: Program shares child assessment results with families at least one time a year at a family-teacher conference.

Family & Community Engagement **Quality Activity J:** Families are invited at least two times a year to provide information and/or participate in the development of program activities to provide opportunities for the family's culture to be infused in the program.
