## Early Care and Education Services Data Dashboard Methodology

**thread** contracted with McKinley Research Group, formerly McDowell Group, to analyze and present data on the need for and availability of early care and education (ECE) services for Alaska children from birth through 5 years of age. This dashboard describes the status of early care and education in Alaska through the following indicators.

- Demand for early care and education services
- Supply of early care and education services
- Affordability of care
- School readiness

The sources for each data point in the dashboard are described below, along with notes about methodology where applicable. Data included in this dashboard was selected according to relevance, quality, and availability over time.
